River Run Park | Denver, CO

DHM provided planning services for river improvements along the South Platte River including a 10' wide multi-use trail, vegetation, interpretive features, trailhead improvements, overlooks and seating areas alongside proposed water play features in the river. Work includes community outreach, conceptual design, design development, 3D imaging and construction documents.
