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NOTABLE WORK

4 Diamond Ranch | Wilsall, MT

In collaboration with the consultant team, DHM is developing a master plan for the 26,000 acres ranch, located in the expansive Shields Valley near Wilsall, MT. The diverse ecology spanning the ranch provides a number of unique habitats for a rich dynamic of plants and wildlife. The physical setting of the ranch consists of several drainages, a section of the Shields river, a reservoir, a number of existing structures, existing roads and trail systems and a significant agricultural component including agricultural fields and various irrigation structures.

DHM is developing a master plan for the overall ranch which embraces ecological habitat improvements, along with the siting of two ranch headquarters, the owner's main residence, ponds, barns and other outbuildings, while enhancing the unique recreational opportunities of the property.

Portland to Milwaukee Lightrail | Portland, OR

DHM Design and artist Tad Savinar collaborated on plans the new light rail system running south out of Portland to Milwaukie. Travelling via light rail has long been a staple of Portland culture and the project expanded and improved the accessibility of the popular form of transportation. Opened on September 12, 2015, the Portland-Milwaukie light rail transit line travels 7.3 miles between PSU, inner Southeast Portland, Milwaukie and Oak Grove in north Clackamas County. These connections between working class neighborhoods and industrial zones were designed with the concept that each rail station uniquely expresses the neighborhood that the light rail passes through.

Astoria Hot Springs | Jackson, WY

Until it was closed to the public in 1999, Astoria Hot Springs was a scenic, family-oriented RV and tent campground with mineral hot spring pools, located on the banks of the Snake River about 15 minutes south of Jackson Hole, Wyoming. Astoria Hot Springs offered great swimming and camping for locals and summer visitors touring nearby Grand Teton and Yellowstone national parks. Developed in the early 1960s, the complex, including a large outdoor pool for children and adults and an adjacent triangular "kiddie pool", was for many years the only local resource for children to learn to swim and for families to enjoy pool time together.
