MOST NOTABLE WORK

Lift One Neighborhood - COWOP

This project encompasses approximately 8 acres at the base of Aspen Mountain which includes the original Lift. It is a public/private partnership between the City of Aspen, the Aspen Ski Company and 2 hotel developments. DHM provided planning, design, and graphic support to a 27 person citizen's committee throughout a 6 month public process (COWOP); participating in weekly meetings, design charrettes, and presentations. DHM generated products based on direction given by the COWOP group, producing site plan studies, graphic visualizations and submittal documents for the agreed upon plan.

DHM developed a master plan for this 22,000 acre working cattle ranch in Wyoming. The plan creates a greater awareness of the connectivity between environmental systems and human interventions, consequently engaging people with the land and strengthening their dedication to its preservation. The Master Plan proposes simple and impactful mitigation strategies for the restoration of native habitat, the preservation of valuable resources, and planning for a regenerative future.

Working as a part of a team lead by artist Tad Savinar, DHM has developed a ranch master plan for approximately 5,000 acres in southeastern Oregon. Located in the heart of the Steens Mountains, the site is surrounded by cattle ranches that have been in operation for several generations. The site development includes working ranch facilities, main residence, artist retreat, and the restoration of eroded drainage ways to reestablish important wildlife habitat.

Breckenridge Riverwalk

Beginning in 1991, Dave has assisted Breckenridge with the design, construction and restoration of the Blue River, which runs through the center of town. The project continues to evolve, but initially included civic/open spaces along the river, pedestrian and auto bridges, street improvements, and a summer season performing arts center.

His philosophy revolves around understanding the built environment as a response to natural and cultural conditions. During his career, he has been involved with numerous, award-winning, planning and design projects throughout North America.
