NOTABLE WORK

Aspen Valley Ranch | Aspen, CO

DHM Design is creating a master plan for the Aspen Valley Ranch, located in the heart of the Roaring Fork Valley. The 800+ acre ranch borders the White River National Forest and has been a working ranch since the 1800's. That tradition will continue with the restoration of the historic barn, new agricultural buildings, residential buildings, pasture restoration, the design and installation of a new irrigation system, and extensive habitat improvements.

Mill Street | Aspen, CO

North Mill Street in Aspen is the most important north-south street in the City, bridging the Roaring Fork River and connecting the mostly residential areas on the north side of the river to the employment and commerce center of downtown, south of the river. Though this street sees daily traffic counts second only to Main Street/ Highway 82 passing through Aspen and is a primary bicycle and pedestrian route, it lacks a cohesive streetscape character and is dominated by the automobile. The City of Aspen saw the opportunity to create a model Complete Street, balancing the needs of all users of the corridor and taking advantage of the wide street to include bike lanes, detached sidewalks, new streetscape planting in bioswales, improved pedestrian crossings, enhanced connectivity, improved intersections, and traffic calming, all without reducing the level of service of North Mill Street and the adjacent intersections.

Grayhead Residence | Telluride, CO

Located on a mesa 500 feet above valley floor and the Town of Telluride, this residence commands expansive views of the San Juan mountains, including several 14,000' peaks. The design of the home reflects the character and land form of the site. Carefully sited amongst stands of existing gambel oaks, the building is tucked into a small rise in the land and steps naturally with the grade, descending toward the valley. Disturbance to the land is minimized, and native plantings surround the house and cross through the developed landscape. A planted roof over the garage connects the house to the native meadow context of the site. The site design includes a small lawn and gardens, waterfall and stream, pond, fire pits with stone seating, and an outdoor cabana with kitchen.
