Aspen Valley Ranch | Aspen, CO

DHM Design is creating a master plan for the Aspen Valley Ranch, located in the heart of the Roaring Fork Valley. The 800+ acre ranch borders the White River National Forest and has been a working ranch since the 1800's. That tradition will continue with the restoration of the historic barn, new agricultural buildings, residential buildings, pasture restoration, the design and installation of a new irrigation system, and extensive habitat environments.

Rocky Mountain Institute | Basalt, CO

DHM Design developed a landscape design plan for the new Rocky Mountain Institute Innovation Center in downtown Basalt. The Rocky Mountain Institute is a non-profit research and education foundation dedicated to the efficient and sustainable use of resources. The new building has received LEED Platinum Certification and Passive House Certification. The landscape embraces the riparian woodland habitat that surrounds the center and connects it to the adjacent river corridor. Stormwater management is a critical aspect of the design and incorporates stormwater-fed irrigation, catchment basin gardens and native plantings.

Hotel Lenado | Aspen, CO

Hotel Lenado is a historic boutique hotel in Aspen, Colorado positioned between some of Aspen's historic neighbors and downtown core. The building is undergoing a full reconstruction updating it with a more modern aesthetic while also updating its usage to serve as a boutique hotel, private housing units, employee housing units, and public amenities such as a bar and game room fronting a historic park. DHM has been brought on to lead the site design and landscape architecture in this collaborative and innovative project. The building sits on a confined and challenging site where DHM has carefully integrated the site with the surrounding neighborhoods and parks while also being careful to preserve several large existing mature trees and implementing elegantly detailed storm water bioretention gardens. The project blends public and private spaces and increases accessibility all while beautifying the neighborhood.
