NOTABLE WORK

Second Creek Greenway | Commerce City, CO

DHM Design provided design, construction documentation and construction administration for the Second Creek Greenway which links the Rocky Mountain National Wildlife Refuge to the northern neighborhoods of Commerce City. The project included 3 pedestrian bridges, a board walk, trail connections to neighborhoods and wayfinding signage.

East Bank Trail & Open Space | Denver, CO

This one mile segment of trail along the east bank of the South Platte River provides an important link between the existing Mary Carter Greenway at South Prince Street and Big Dry Creek Trail to the north. Open Space amenities include two pedestrian bridges, rest areas and two trailheads with shade, picnic tables and parking. Open Space areas were re-vegetated with native grasses and a variety of trees planted by community volunteers.

Witherspoon Trail & Greenway | Anchorage, KY

2008 American Trails National Award

DHM Design with The Greenway Team, prepared a greenway master plan for this one mile scenic corridor which runs through a hardwood forest in the heart of Anchorage, Kentucky. The greenway provides an important link between the city's newest town center, schools, businesses, neighborhoods and the "Tom" Sawyer State Park to the west. The project includes a 300' span signature pedestrian bridge, natural trails, an amphitheater, a fishing pier, a wetland boardwalk, gateway features and an interpretive wayfinding display throughout.

Sand Creek Greenway | Commerce City, CO

CCASLA Merit Award for Planning & Land Steward Designation

Working with the City of Commerce City, DHM prepared a master plan for a five mile segment of Sand Creek providing a regional trail connection to the South Platte River and the Stapleton Redevelopment Area. The project site at the gateway to the City, included site restoration and cleanup, wetland enhancements and interpretive opportunities.
