NOTABLE WORK

Oklahoma Whitewater Park | Oklahoma City, OK

DHM Design was the landscape architect on the project design team with Elliott and Associates, Architects, and S2o Design and Engineering to design the Oklahoma City Whitewater park. The whitewater park is a part of an ongoing downtown economic development effort that has revitalized the city’s riverfront and attracted the national office of USA Canoe Kayak. The \$25 million park project features manmade pumped channels that create whitewater for paddlers of all abilities. DHM’s focus was to create a functional visitor and spectator areas that complimented the surrounding design of the channels and the architecture. As a City facility and associated with the Oklahoma River Boathouse District, the park provides water-based family recreation and hosts national and international paddling events, recently hosting the Olympic trials.

Ridgway Streetscape | Ridgway, CO

The Town of Ridgway is currently facing rapid growth and development creating the need to improve town infrastructure without sacrificing the strong historic western town flavor. DHM began work on Ridgway’s streetscape in 2006 to provide recommendations for improving the streetscape. The planning process included a thorough evaluation of the physical condition of the town core regarding circulation, parking, drainage, and walkways. The team successfully hosted a series of workshops that gained input from community members regarding the economics and future vision for the town.

In April 2014, the community of Ridgway approved a ballot question allowing the sale of municipal bonds and increasing property taxes. The Colorado Department of Transportation and the Town of Ridgway are partnered on this project. The project includes hard-surfacing streets, pedestrian sidewalk, storm drainage, decorative lighting, landscaping, and artist-designed and built site furnishings (benches, artwork, trash/recycle receptacles, low-level lighting elements). Highway 62 will have a center turn lane from Laura Street to the Uncompahgre River Bridge. Ridgway’s Historic Business District north of Highway 62, and the Highway 62 corridor through the Town from Amelia Street to U.S. Highway 550. Construction was completed in the Spring of 2017.
