Royal Palms | Kauai, HI

Master-planning and detailed landscape architectural design for a new 21-acre destination resort with extensive on-site amenities, including three distinct resort pools, extensive sub-tropical gardens, water features, landscape structures and event spaces. The property features a protected archaeological site which provided inspiration for the overall landscape character and designed elements.

Private Residence | Aspen, CO

DHM Design is providing site planning and landscape architecture services for this new residence in Aspen, Colorado. The overall site plan is influenced by geometries created by existing trees and the natural conditions occurring on the site, such as wind direction, solar access throughout the year, and views. The overall site plan incorporates a formal zen garden, outdoor pool and grill, lounge space, and garden plantings with perimeter trails. Other design elements include sculpture siting, opportunities for art installations, and a raised vegetable garden with a custom willow trellis and recommended 6 yr crop rotation specific to the Aspen climate.

June Bug Ranch | Basalt, CO

Situated on the historic Rio Grande Railroad Corridor within the historic "Potato Belt" of the Roaring Fork Valley, Junebug Farm is an example of a property that has outstanding recreational, ecological, and agricultural values. This portion of the mid-valley has a special sense of place, highlighted by the Roaring Fork River, which is the most important and iconic attribute of Junebug Farm. The property layout provides exceptional opportunities for continued historical agricultural use including natural food production as well as current and future recreational uses of all types.
