Basalt Underpass | Basalt, CO

DHM teamed with SGM, Inc to provide conceptual designs, public input process, and technical documentation to improve the pedestrian crossing experience at Basalt Avenue and Highway 82 in Basalt. The intersection is home to one of the most heavily used bus stops in the valley and is the primary means of access for residents on both sides of the highway to schools, recreational trails, and commercial uses. DHM worked with Basalt, CDOT, RFTA, and Pitkin County to create an underpass that serves the needs of the community and is an open, welcoming, and safe crossing.

The Basalt River Restoration represents a collaborative and comprehensive approach to achieving a number of long-standing social, environmental, economic and community goals including public access to the river, a riverfront park, redefinition of the floodplain and the transformation of a prominent downtown corner location. DHM was retained by the Town of Basalt to shepherd the site planning effort and was involved in all aspects of the process from community meetings and design to coordination with engineers and federal agencies for proposed restoration improvements. In the end, this project offers the best of public/private partnerships resulting in a new riverfront park that will add immeasurably to the character and vitality of the Town of Basalt.

Lift One Neighborhood - COWOP | Aspen, CO

This project encompasses approximately 8 acres at the base of Aspen Mountain which includes the original Lift. It is a public/private partnership between the City of Aspen, the Aspen Ski Company and 2 hotel developments. DHM provided planning, design, and graphic support to a 27 person citizen's committee throughout a 6 month public process (COWOP); participating in weekly meetings, design charrettes, and presentations. DHM generated products based on direction given by the COWOP group, producing site plan studies, graphic visualizations and submittal documents for the agreed upon plan.
